

### Eligibility:

At the time of application, candidates must meet the following requirements:

- U.S. citizen
- 15-18 years of age at the start of the NSLI-Y program
- Enrolled in high school at the time of application
- Minimum 2.5 GPA

Previous language study not required. All levels of language ability encouraged to apply.
